4. CONFIRMATION OF PREVIOUS MINUTES

4.1 Chittering Bushfire Advisory Committee meeting: 11 June 2024

4.1 OFFICER RECOMMENDATION

5. REPORTS

5.1 Chief Bushfire Control Officer

Graham Furlong presented to the Committee, providing an overview of operations, updates and other information pertinent to the Committee.

Paul Groves enquired about the spraying of Shire verges. Graham provided information about the Shire's spraying program relating to Shire verges and strategic firebreaks. Paul Groves requested a list of properties that have approved variations for their firebreaks, Graham stated that not many are approved to have variations. Graham offered that if anyone identified properties that are non-compliant to send them through to the Shire and we will inspect them.

Aaron Cover addressed the Committee, stating that the work being done on the stations has been great but the contractors conducting the works have not been signing in at the station when they are entering. Aaron described a particular scenario where this had occurred.

5.2 DFES District Officer – North East Metropolitan

Murray McBride and spoke to following:

- Murray has been a part of a working group for the State Hazard Plan for fire a few changes may affect the Shire, DFES & DBCA and the way fires are run – changes will be communicated when they are made.
- A Starlink kit is available for deployment in the regional office. All Incident Control Vehicles are being fitted with Starlink soon.
- Delivered a Crew Leader Course with Shelly in Lower Chittering for Chittering brigades in early October.
- Incident Control Training being held in the coming weeks at Lower Chittering.
- Update on recruitment for the Community Emergency Services Manager role Murray is in the final stages of shortlisting, once complete, interviews will commence.

- 19 March 2024 was the date of the Redhill fire which had Aboriginal Cultural Heritage site impact. There has been lots of discussion regarding this issue. A process is being developed to make it easier should a fire occur in an area where sites exist.
- DBCA are currently limited with the areas that they can currently burn due to dry wetlands.
- Major changes in DFES leadership Eight new superintendents have been appointed. There will be changes with District Officers and the areas they are allocated to.
- An Upper Chittering brigade member sent a letter to the Minister about radios being replaced.
 Murray detailed that this is not the process, and an ICT request must be put in place. Murray
 expressed his disappointment with the volunteer's behaviour. Murray requested that these
 types of issues be escalated to him directly and not go to the extremes of contacting the
 Minister.

5.3 Acting Chief Executive Officer

Scott Clayton addressed the meeting and expressed thanks to all the brigades and their members for the few call outs had recently and for the ones in future. Scott requested all members to stay safe this summer and if brigades need anything the Shire, Graham and Jodie are here to support them.

Shelly Pannell addressed the Committee and thanked Jodie for her help with correspondence, general communication and the Fire Control Officer packs that were prepared this year. Shelly stated that it was the first time these had been prepared for the Fire Control Officers and they felt valued as a result. The Committee moved to thank Jodie for her assistance and support.





6. GENERAL BUSINESS

Murray McBride provided more information on the Aboriginal Cultural Heritage areas when there is a fire running through an area. Neil Harvey asked about the process of identifying the areas prior to a call out. The Committee discussed the process and implications. Ben Riddle enquired if it is only machinery and tracking that is prohibited, Murray confirmed that it covered all activities and provided more information. Discussion was held by the Committee around personal responsibility around fighting fires in areas with sites.

Aaron Cover stated that he had received correspondence from a member of the public about obtaining water in the Shire. Aaron stated that this person had purchased a property where the water tank had been left completely empty on purchase. Councillor Carmel Ross stated that generally people buy water via private contractors. Scott Clayton added that the Shire may be able to help if its genuinely for bushfire protection and would be assessed on a case by case basis if such a request was made.

Daniel Smith stated that with the 3G shutdown that there is going to be issues with contacting Wannamal members as some areas in Wannamal are not covered by 4G service. Wannamal Light Tanker currently has a 3G only mobile phone that needs to be replaced.

Paul Groves stated that Chittering Incident Support Brigade recently had to pay to attend the Bindoon Show and has never had to in the past. Paul stated that he believed all brigades should be attending as a united front to represent the Chittering Fire Services. Jenny Johnson from the Bindoon Agricultural Society stated that previously Bindoon brigade attended to deal with the fireworks and did not have to pay but as that arrangement no longer existed, all attendees had to pay. Scott Clayton suggested around the Shire budgeting and paying for it in future or all brigades joining together to share the cost.

Paul Groves added that Chittering Incident Support attended an exercise at Mundaring. Paul the exercise highlighted some communications issues that can occur with complex incidents. The report from the exercise will be sent on for others to refer to if they wish. Paul stated that Mundaring have a preformed Incident Management Team that get together and train monthly. Paul stated that this could be something for Graham to consider. Additionally, Chittering Incident Support Brigade attended Gingin to support their Cadets Program and provided information about the visit.

Kim Haeusler asked about upgrading the midband radio in his private vehicle, Murray gave Kim information about radios and the recent upgrade project.
